

Foreword

The Imo State Executive Council adopted the 2024-2024 Imo State Business-Enabling Reform Action Plans (IMOBERAP) on 13th December 2023. The Business Enabling Environment



Programme (SABER) is a three-year (January 2023- December 2025) performance-based initiative created jointly by the Federal Government of Nigeria and the World Bank. The program is a \$750 million operation comprising two main areas – a \$730 million Program-for-Results Financing (PforR) component and \$20 million technical assistance for investment project financing. The initiative, which is available to all states and the Federal Capital Authority, seeks to enhance land administration efficiency, the regulatory

framework for private investment in fiber optic infrastructure, services provided by investment promotion agencies, and public-private partnership units services offered by investment promotion agencies and public-private partnership units. It also aims to improve the efficiency and transparency of government-to-business services in participating states.

The SABER initiative also aims to offer additional incentives, such as employing results-based funding to improve the business climate and facilitate the crowding-in of large-scale private-sector investments. The programme's qualifying requirements include drafting an annual action plan with private sector collaborators, which must be authorized by the State Executive Council (SEC) and publicized online. Imo State's government is dedicated to enhancing the business climate and has created the State Business Enabling Reforms Initiative (IMOBERAP).

The IMOBERAP is a one-year plan (Jan. 2024- Dec.2024) designed as a coherent platform for continued economic development and social progress in Imo State. The plan provides a foundation for the state's continuous corporate, economic, and social growth. This strategy intends to develop the form as a knowledge-based economy, while also focusing on broadening the sources of economic growth. The plan will serve as an annual accelerator and reform tool, coordinating the effective delivery of priority reforms of select ministries, departments, and agencies in six significant areas: starting a business reform, dealing with construction reforms, registering property reforms, paying taxes reforms, trading across borders reforms, obtaining electricity reforms, and obtaining credits.

I do not doubt that the reform plan will increase the size of our economy, raise human capital, expand opportunity, put more people to work, and give social safety lines.


